Chaplain's Corner

A Light in The Darkness New York Fire Department Chaplain Father Mychal Judge A Legacy of Love on September 11, 2001

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. This month marks the 25th anniversary of the unprovoked and dastardly attack on our country carried out by evil Islamic terrorists on September 11, 2001. That day, 2,977 people were murdered in cold blood at the World Trade Center (WTC), the Pentagon, and those brave souls who went down as heroes on Flight 93. In this chaplain's corner, I would like to share with you the story of the New York Fire Department (NYFD) Chaplain, Father Mychal Judge.

On the morning of 9/11, when news of the attack on the WTC reached him, Fr. Judge immediately sprang into action. Without hesitation, he made his way to the North Tower, where the NYFD had set up a command post. As firemen raced into the burning buildings, risking their lives to save others, Fr. Judge was there with them, offering prayers, comfort, and the Holy Sacraments.

It was there, in the midst of chaos and danger, that Fr. Judge performed his final act of love and devotion. As he knelt in prayer, praying for the safety of the firemen and all those trapped in the towers, the South Tower collapsed. Debris rained down upon the area, and Fr. Judge was struck and killed by falling rubble. He was later carried out of the tower by firemen. The image of his lifeless body being carried from the wreckage became one of the most poignant symbols of the tragedy of that day. The firemen laid Fr. Judge's body on the altar at St. Peter Parish, just 40 yards from the destroyed WTC. Fr. Judge was officially recorded as Victim 0001, the first certified fatality of the attacks. His death was a profound loss, not only to those who knew him but to all who were touched by his example of selflessness, love, and devotion.

The 9/11 attacks were motivated by an ideology of hatred that sought to instill fear and division. But the life and death of Fr. Judge stand as a potent reminder that love, especially the Christian love exemplified by Jesus Christ, can and will overcome such hatred.

As members of the VFW, we are called to remember and honor the sacrifices of those who serve our nation. Father Mychal Judge's life and death embody the very ideals that we hold dear: courage, sacrifice, and unwavering commitment to others. Let us, therefore, strive to follow his example, to be beacons of hope and love in our own communities, and to carry forward the legacy of those who, like Father Judge, and all those who fought and died in the War on Terrorism, gave everything in service to others. "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). God love you!

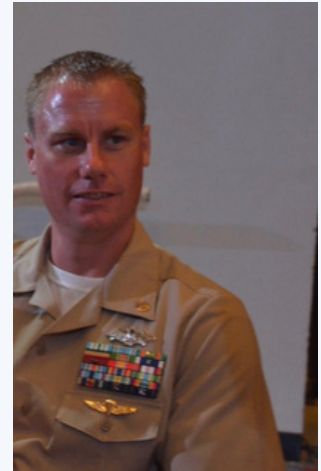

This Month in History

September 1, 1939 — World War II Begins

Germany invaded Poland, prompting Britain and France to declare war two days later. The invasion marked the beginning of World War II, eventually involving more than 30 nations.



September 2, 1945 — World War II Officially Ends

Representatives of Japan formally surrendered aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay. General Douglas MacArthur signed for the Allies and Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz signed for the U.S.

September 5, 1781 — Battle of the Chesapeake

A French fleet defeated the British Royal Navy near the mouth of Chesapeake Bay, preventing British forces from reinforcing or evacuating Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown, leading to an American victory there.

September 7, 1940 — The Blitz Begins

Nazi Germany began a sustained bombing campaign against London and other British cities. For the next eight months, British civilians and the Royal Air Force endured relentless attacks.

September 11, 2001 — Terrorist Attacks on the United States

Nearly 3,000 people were killed when terrorists hijacked four commercial airliners. The attacks profoundly changed American national security and led to U.S. military operations and the Global War on Terrorism.

September 12, 1814 — Battle of North Point

American militia forces confronted British troops advancing toward Baltimore during the War of 1812. Their resistance helped delay the British advance and gave Baltimore's defenders time to prepare for the attack.

September 13–14, 1814 — Bombardment of Fort McHenry

British warships bombarded Fort McHenry for approximately 25 hours. The American flag flying over the fort the following morning inspired Francis Scott Key to write the poem that became "The Star-Spangled Banner."

September 15, 1950 — Inchon Landing

U.S. Marines, supported by Navy and allied forces, launched a daring amphibious assault at Inchon during the Korean War. Their success broke the North Korean advance and allowed United Nations forces to recapture Seoul.

September 17, 1787 — U.S. Constitution Signed

Delegates to the Constitutional Convention signed the United States Constitution in Philadelphia. The document established the framework of the federal government and designated the President as Commander in Chief of the nation's armed forces.

September 17, 1862 — Battle of Antietam

Union and Confederate armies clashed near Sharpsburg, Maryland, in the bloodiest single day in American military history. Approximately 23,000 soldiers were killed, wounded or missing.

September 18, 1947 — U.S. Air Force Established

The United States Air Force officially became an independent branch of the Armed Forces with implementation of the National Security Act of 1947.

September 18, 2020 — Space Force Enlists Its First Recruits

The U.S. Space Force, established in December 2019, swore in its first group of enlisted recruits at military entrance processing stations around the country, another milestone in building America's newest military service.

September 23, 1949 — President Harry S. Truman Announces the Soviet Union Has an Atomic Bomb

Truman revealed that the Soviet Union had successfully tested an atomic weapon. The development ended America's nuclear monopoly and dramatically changed the military balance of the emerging Cold War.

September 27, 1942 — Marines Attack Along the Matanikau

U.S. Marines launched operations against Japanese forces near the Matanikau River. The fighting was part of the months-long struggle for control of Guadalcanal, America's first major ground offensive of World War II.
